

1. An acknowledgement that the institution signed and returned to the Department the Certification and Agreement and the assurance that the institution has used the applicable amount of funds designated under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.

RTI/C was allocated \$307,498.00 under Section 314 (a)(1) of CRRSAA. RTI/C signed a Certification and Agreement for the student portion on May 6, 2020 and returned it to the Department thereby assuring that the school would use no less than 50% of the allocation to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. RTI/C signed a Certification and Agreement for the institutional portion on January 29, 2021 and returned it to the Department thereby assuring that the school would still meet the original obligation with regards to awarding Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.

2. The total amount of funds that the institution will receive or has received from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

RTI/C received an award of \$105,153.00 on January 19, 2021 for the purpose of providing Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. On February 3, 2021, RTI/C received an institutional award of \$202,345.00.

3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs as of the date of submission (i.e., as of the initial report and every calendar quarter thereafter).

Between January 1, 2021 and March 31, 2021, RTI/C awarded \$148,940.00 to students in the form of Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

4. The estimated total number of students at the institution that are eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Between January 1, 2021 and March 31, 2021, RTI/C had 73 students who were eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

5. The total number of students who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Between January 1, 2021 and March 31, 2021, 72 students received Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Any U.S. citizen or eligible non-citizen who is enrolled in an eligible program is potentially eligible for grant assistance under CRRSAA, which can be used for any component of the student's cost of attendance or for emergency costs that arise due to coronavirus, such as tuition, food, housing, health care (including mental health care), or child care. Priority must to

be given to students with financial need. RTI/C has developed a tiered award system that gives priority to students with the most financial need. This tiered award system is weighted heavily for students with Pell Eligibility, but also recognizes the financial need of students with low levels of gift aid.

When possible, the Financial Aid department met with groups of students and presented information about the CRRSAA and the awarding methodology. In cases where this was not possible, students were called directly and/or emailed.
