From the Superintendent:

The first semester is now complete in the North Platte School District and many new learning opportunities for our students, both inside and outside of the classrooms, are already underway as we enter into the second half of the school year. As I travel throughout our buildings it is exciting to see students and staff members working together to reach the high standards and goals that have been set for our children to reach.

So far, we have been fortunate to not have a day of school cancelled due to inclement weather. We were able to build in an additional 60 hours into our school calendar this year over the state required 1044 hours, which does give us some cushion on potential cancellations due to weather. Hopefully, that will be more than sufficient to absorb any potential weather days without having to add days to the end of the school year. When wintry conditions arrive, it is often not an easy decision on whether to keep school in session or to cancel. We try



to keep several factors in mind, with the safety of our children being the number one consideration. Usually, the decision process consists of driving the roads within the district, consulting with Cassidy Bus Service, monitoring temperatures and wind chills, and talking with neighboring districts. It is generally better for student learning if we do not have extra breaks in attendance, but it is sometimes necessary to do so.

The board of education filing date ended in December. The current terms of Bennett French, James Kubly, and Jeffrey Hinton expire in April. Kubly and Hinton both signed back up for the next election. We want to thank Bennett French for his nine years of service on the board. Jennifer Ralston and Becky Hoffman also signed up for the board this year. We will have an election on April 4. The four prospective members will be running for three positions. We will have a "Meet the Candidates" night in March.

The 2022-2023 school year has been mostly stable for the district from a financial standpoint. Overall, I expect the district to have revenues exceed expenditures by around \$100,000 in our non-restricted



funds. Next year is more uncertain, but the district has built up enough reserves over the past eight years to ensure the overall financial stability of the district. We expect one more round of federal stimulus funding through ESSER III in the amount of \$429,000.

Please contact me if you have questions throughout the school year. Parents, staff members, and students working together can ensure our children continue to receive a high quality education.

ELEMENTARY & INTERMEDIATE

It is hard to believe the first semester of school is over. Time really does fly! Students at North Platte Elementary and Intermediate have been hard at work. We appreciate the dedication to education that our families have demonstrated throughout this school year.

Fall and gingerbread, oh my! The preschoolers have had many exciting experiences as they play to learn. Some of their favorite activities included: hot cocoa cafe, reindeer dust, pumpkin decorating, and little old lady. These activities really helped them to develop their fine motor, gross motor, language, social-emotional, adaptive, and academic skills!

Their knowledge of phonics grows as a new letter is introduced each week. Use of calming strategies (sensory materials and Conscious Discipline breathing strategies), emotion visuals, and the break area (safe spot) has really helped in teaching self-regulation skills. As our class reads both fiction and non-fiction books, the preschoolers have lots of opportunities to demonstrate book handling skills, learn new vocabulary words, answer comprehension questions, make predictions, and learn other elements in literature. Preschool really loves time in the sensory room, but we hope it warms up soon and we can get back to outdoor recess (they ask about going outside a lot)!

Second quarter brought lots of learning and some holiday fun for kindergarteners. Kindergarten had a lot of fun getting ready for our PTA Turkey Tango program, making costumes, and practicing. The students performed for their parents and did a great job! In December, we read many different Gingerbread Man stories and charted the characters, setting and problem/solution for each book. At the end of the unit, we had a gingerbread hunt and decorated gingerbread men cookies. We started our reindeer unit and made our reindeer shirts as well. We concluded the second quarter with our Polar Express day. In math this quarter, the students learned about 2-D shapes and we learned how to add two numbers together. Lastly, in writing, the students have been working on personal narratives and wrote nonfiction stories about reindeer.

First grade began our spelling program this quarter. They learned a new spelling skill each week, "Screech" words that don't follow the rules, and sentences that use those skills. We held our Literature Day parties and Trunk-or-Treat in October, thanks to the help of our awesome parents. We attended the Veteran's Day program at the high school. During Thanksgiving, we wrote stories about a pet turkey. We studied maps by reading books

and making a "Me on the Map" project, where we wrote our addresses. In December, we wrote letters to Santa and his elves responded! We finished off the quarter with Polar Express Day. We wore PJ's, drank hot chocolate, and of course watched Polar Express.

Second quarter flew for 2nd grade! In reading this quarter we focused on main idea and author's purpose. In writing we have completed a couple narratives. One took us on a journey that got us stuck in an ornament. We are looking forward to beginning our next writing unit on opinion writing. In math we used many different strategies to help us subtract. Then we worked on borrowing in subtraction. We had many experiments in science including molding volcanos and making them erupt, witnessing erosion by wind and water, and creating a mudslide. All of these experiments on earth processes tied in well with our schema on landforms from last quarter's social studies unit. We are excited to be back in the classroom and are ready to celebrate obtaining the first semester's AR goal with an AR bash! Second graders have worked really hard at daily independent reading and quiz taking. We look forward to what the third quarter brings!

Hard to believe half of the year is already over! Third graders started off the second quarter learning about poetry and its elements. Cause and effect and figurative language were two new concepts that were introduced. We ended the quarter reading the Magic Tree House book Christmas in Camelot. In math, we finished up our unit over multiplication and moved onto division. Westward expansion was the social studies unit taught. Lewis and Clark along with the Oregon Trail were our primary focus. Students made an Oregon Trail travel brochure to wrap up the unit. In science, students learned about matter and its states. Students conducted a lab emphasizing the properties of different types of

matter. We wrapped up the end of the semester with our AR Bash. All third graders qualified for the bash! We can't wait to see what the second semester will bring!

Fourth graders kept their learning going strong during the 2nd quarter. They enjoyed a Shiloh book study and ended the unit by creating dioramas, board games, and posters. They traveled around the world using passports and learning how Christmas is celebrated in other countries. They even held their very own Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade after researching the history of the parade and the designing and making of the balloons. They continued their learning of early explorers in Social Studies. Reading time provided more opportunities for practice with main idea and details, inferencing, using context clues, and comparing and contrasting. Fourth graders also enjoyed being creative and designing haunted houses, creating bar graphs from their own bags of Skittles, and making/racing Turkey Rockets. They also wrote press releases from the perspective of a disguised Turkey trying to convince the reader that they were not turkeys and therefore shouldn't be eaten. In science, they completed several energy labs as they learned about energy as well as force and motion. We wrapped up the quarter with a reader's theater where the students read a Gingerbread Story from Norway. They made masks to go with their parts and then performed in the library. Following that, students enjoyed pancakes and wassail provided by Mrs. Woodside and Mrs. Walker. They did a fabulous job and we really enjoyed seeing how creative they were!

Fifth graders dug into new content during the second quarter. We learned how to utilize text features and analyze nonfiction pieces of writing. Students read The Island of Blue Dolphins together and identified figurative language, noticed character development, and practiced using comprehension strategies. In social studies students learned about the



events surrounding the Civil War, battles, and the postwar era. Students picked a research project to learn more about a person or place related to the Civil War to expand their knowledge and then shared with the class. Students in math completed many division problems—dividing with decimals, dividing by decimals, dividing decimals by decimals. They may be dreaming about division! Science class covered natural resources, Earth's waters, and how human impact the systems on Earth.

In counseling, kindergarten - 2nd grade continued learning from the Second Step SEL curriculum. Most of quarter two focused on identifying feelings and showing compassion and understanding for others. We learned the meaning of the word "empathy," which we will continue to focus on as the year progresses. We also finished our anti-bullying whole-class lessons and reinforced kindness in our interactions with others as a way to combat bullying behavior. We are continuing to focus on the prosocial behavior we want in ourselves as opposed to the behavior we don't want. In keeping with that idea, we participated in a Kindness Week coloring contest. Prizes were awarded, and the students' artwork was displayed in the counseling classroom. Small groups focusing on topics such as friendship skills, social skills and impulse control, grief, and building a growth mindset are still going strong this quarter. Along with empathy, third quarter counseling lessons will focus on emotion management, which refers to how we handle big emotions in a

safe, respectful way. Learning about emotions, empathy, and emotion management allows students to focus more in the classroom and be more successful with day-to-day interactions with peers. The counseling department and school personnel as a whole appreciate the parents' and guardians' support of these groups and check-ins. Working together, we can provide an array of coping skills for our students, which benefits them inside and outside of the classroom.

We had a fun second quarter in PE at the Elementary and Intermediate! In the Elementary, we got moving with units in Basketball, Dance, Lollipop Paddles, Hockey, and around Christmas time we played "Reindeer Games". In Health, we covered the Respiratory System and Cardiovascular system. Ask them a question about it- they are so smart! At the Intermediate we learned a new game called Handball- they loved it! We also played Basketball, Pillo Polo, Dance, and of course our much anticipated Christmas "Reindeer Games". In Health we covered the Nervous System, Respiratory system and the Cardiovascular system. Quiz them- they won't disappoint!

North Platte Elementary & Intermediate staff and students are looking forward to the second half of the school year. Hopefully, students will learn just as much as they did the first half and also have time for a little fun. Thank you for your support of our schools!

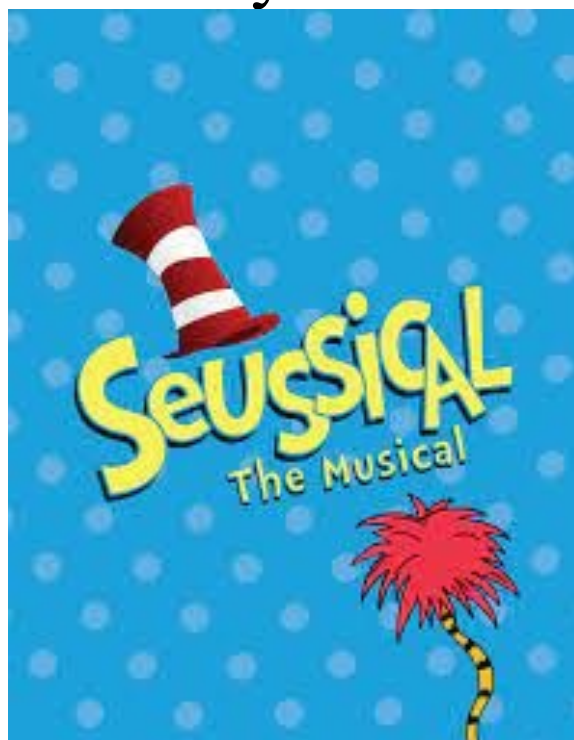

TWO HOUR LATE START GUIDELINES

The decision on whether to have school or not on wintry days is not always an easy one to make. I will drive the roads throughout the district and consult with our transportation company, Cassity Bus Service, when it is a borderline call. On occasion, it may be necessary to implement a two hour late start due to poor road conditions. I will list below a general outline of how a two hour late start would work:

- *All school starting times would be exactly two hours late. School dismissal times would be unchanged.

- *All bus routes would run on the same time frame except for it would occur two hours later.

- *The buildings will be open at their normal time if you need to drop off your student in the morning. They will be supervised by staff members. If you are dropping off at the Dearborn campus, please drop off at the high school commons. Students dropped off at the elementary and intermediate schools may be dropped off at the front doors.

- *If your student will need to be picked up at a different location on those days, then please contact the appropriate building about that now, if possible, so it will be able to be handled should a late start day arise.
