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# Title IA

**Title I:Improving the Academic Achievement of the Disadvantaged** The purpose of this program is to provide all children a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, and high-quality education, and to close educational achievement gaps. To qualify for Title IA funds, a school must have at least 35% of their students qualify for the free and reduced lunch program. We use Title IA grants to:

- Identify students experiencing academic difficulties and to provide timely assistance to help these students meet the State's most challenging content standards.
- Purchase supplemental: staff, programs, materials, and supplies.
- Conduct parent and family engagement meetings, training and activities.

# What is Title 1?

Title I is one of the nation's oldest and largest federal programs supporting elementary and secondary education. More than 90 percent of the school systems in the United States receive some sort of Title I funding.

Through Title I, the federal government disburses money to school districts based on the number of low-income children, ages 5 - 17, in each district as determined by census data. Each district uses its Title I money to supplement and improve regular education programs in order to help students meet state standards.

# Title IIA

The purpose of this program is to provide grants to:

- Increase student achievement consistent with the challenging State academic standards
- Improve the quality and effectiveness of teachers, principals and other school leaders
- Increase the effectiveness of teachers, principals, and other school leaders who are tasked with improving student academic achievement
- Provide low-income and minority students greater access to effective teachers, principals and other school leaders.

# Title IVA

## **Student Support and Academic Enrichment**

The purpose of this program is to improve students' academic achievement by increasing the capacity of schools and local communities to:

- provide all students with access to a well-rounded education;
- improve school conditions for student learning; and
- improve the use of technology in order to improve the academic achievement and digital literacy of all students.
