Principals' Report to the School Board
May 2022

- Teacher appreciation week is May 2-6. Dave and Sarah continue to be grateful for all of our staff and their passion and commitment to help our students be successful. They make Danville School a great place to work. We noted to the staff that while this has been a hugely challenging year all around, we have not seen some of the huge challenges prevalent in many other schools. This is due to the dedication and shared purpose across this building.
- Green Up Day is Friday, May 6. We will take some time to get outside and Green Up our school grounds, the town green, and along the rail trail before Vermont's Green Up Day on Saturday, May 7th. Elementary, middle school, and high school students will be working with their teacher/advisors to Green Up Danville!
- Our 5th, 6th and 7th grade students and staff will be attending Nature's Classroom the week of May 9. This is a residential field trip program that emphasizes experiential education. This trip tends to be one which students talk about fondly for years to come.
- Spring Fling will be returning to Danville on May 26. We are excited to welcome Her Majesty's Secret Circus to perform for the school on Spring Fling Day. Students will also enjoy a cookout/picnic lunch.
- Danville Seniors will be presenting their Senior Service Projects at a Community Night on Friday, May 6th, from 4-5:30. Presentations will be followed by a poster fair and a 6:00 taco dinner hosted by the PTG. The public is welcome! We are so happy to welcome the community back to Community Night and share all of the exciting inquiry and service demonstrated by the class of 2022.
 - The art mural from the Arts Festival will also be unveiled during the Community Night.
- State testing for SBAC (3rd-9th grades) and VTSA (5th, 8th and 11th grades) started on 4/27. Teachers are working to adjust schedules to fit this in.
- Planning for end-of-year events is underway. Expect announcements soon about 8th grade and HS graduation, as well as other celebrations. 8th grade graduation will be Friday, June 10th, and DHS graduation Saturday, June 11th.

- Employee contracts are due in the middle and end of May. While we do not anticipate a large turnover, we expect to be hiring for a few positions. We are still trying to fill 2 part-time ESSER-funded interventionist positions at the elementary level; however, this is proving to be difficult.
- We are in final conversations with a great candidate for our middle school math position, which will enable Paula Pearce to fill the secondary math intervention role, now vacant for the second year due to a lack of applicants.

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Student Services Board Report- May 2022

1. Hiring

- a. Speech Language Pathologists (SLPs)
 1. We have two SLP's leaving at the end of the school year. We recently have hired one SLP and are in the process of interviewing for the second position. We are hopeful to fill the second SLP position by early May.
- b. Occupational Therapist (OT)
 1. Hannah Bloom has resigned her OT position. Hannah worked at Cabot, Twinfield, and Walden this past school year. She and her family recently moved to the Williston area. She is planning to take care of her young family and her parents this coming school year. We held interviews before April break and the team has recommended an applicant for the position.

2. Medicaid Administrative Claiming Grant (MAC)

Our MAC grant was submitted to the Vermont Health Department on April 15, 2021. The health department determines reimbursable personnel costs for medicaid administrative services provided to our students based on personnel costs (of our school counselors and nurses), percentage of Medicaid eligible students across our SU, and our staff's time performing a range of health-related services to students daily to ensure their overall development. Our nurses and school counselors complete a Random Moment of Time Study several times a year outlining their duties and responsibilities. This year, our MAC grant totaled \$39,740.

The \$39,740 will fund a variety of opportunities for all students across all seven schools. Activities such as the tooth tutor, school gardens, Siskin program, running program, bicycle equipment, weekend/ after school outdoor expedition, outdoor winter activities equipment such as snowshoes & skis are some of the different activities funded through this grant.

3. Selective Monitoring -AOE

Our Indicator 13, Student Transition Plans and documentation were submitted March 10th. We received notification that we scored 100% on our submission. For this submission, we submitted 22 student IEP transition plans for students in grades 9-12.

4. End of the year

- a. Child Count-We will be working on our Child Count as the school year ends. The Child Count Submission is due to the state by July 15, 2022.
- b. Extended School Year (ESY) Services- Special educators are continuing to work with families to determine ESY services and appropriate support for students attending the summer program.

- c. Final Progress reports- Special educators will be working on marking IEP progress reports (k-12) and IEP outcomes (Pre-k) at the end of the school year. For students who are graduating, special educators are required to complete senior summary or performance reports prior to their graduation.

I continue to be impressed with the work that everyone is doing, their resiliency to continue to move forward, everyone's positivity, and their dedication to all students and families.
