Dear Parent(s) and Guardians of Danville School Students,

In accordance with the assurances of the federal Title I law, parents of students in any school receiving Title I funds may request, and the District will provide, the following information regarding their child's teacher:

1. Whether the student's teacher--
 - a. Has met State qualifications and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction
 - b. Is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived
 - c. Is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher
2. Whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications
