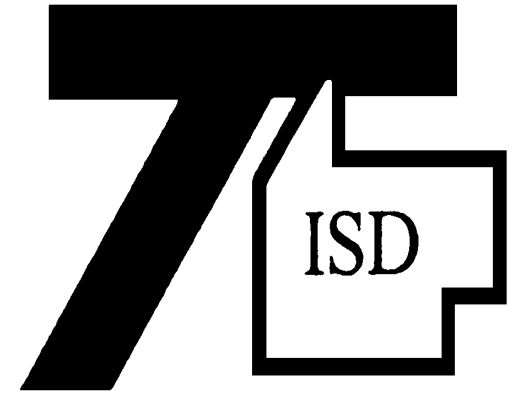

Definition of homeless includes the following living situations:

- ◆ Shelter, motel, vehicle, or campground
- ◆ On the street
- ◆ Unaccompanied youth
- ◆ Doubled up with friends or relatives due to economic hardship

The McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act ensures that all youth in transition have access to a free and appropriate public school education.

Education is the key to success!

Eligible students have the right to:

- ◆ Immediate enrollment
- ◆ Attend their school of origin or school of residence
- ◆ Receive transportation to school
- ◆ Enroll and attend classes while the school arranges for the transfer of school and immunization records
- ◆ Receive the same special programs and services, if needed, as provided to all other students served in these programs



Resources provided to youth in transition:

- ◆ Free/Reduced breakfast and lunch
- ◆ School Supplies
- ◆ Transportation to school
- ◆ Necessary school clothing
- ◆ Tutoring
- ◆ Referrals to local counseling agencies, food pantries, shelter, housing agencies
- ◆ Summer school programs
- ◆ Access to preschool programs including GSRP, Head Start, and Early On programs
