Representatives from the Education Sports and Entertainment (ESE) Networks visited the Perry Center on December 10th to deliver Audio-Visual equipment to the school's Audio Video Technology and Film (AVTF) program. The program and its instructor, T. Mukenge are one of the state's recipients of the Georgia Audio-Video Grant. The grant provides \$25,000 worth of equipment, software and training to AVTF programs throughout the state.



Perry's AVTF program will use the grant to teach streaming, editing and authoring which are key skills for the AVTF industry. Cameras, tripods, and computer work stations with Adobe Creative Suites were among items received. In addition, recipients received website hosting on the ESE Network for live and archived streaming.
